



## **Maine Maritime Museum Mooring and Dockage Information**

Welcome to Maine Maritime Museum! The docking and mooring facilities at MMM are available seasonally as a courtesy to our members and visitors.

The Museum does not have a dockmaster, so the proper and safe use of the docks and moorings is the responsibility of the vessel's captain and/or owner.

There is no charge for day visitors-dockage and/or moorings are included with Museum admission.

For overnight dockage, fees are charged on a per night basis.

### **Fitting-Out Pier—North End**

- Floating pier for vessels less than 40'
- Must not block loading zone of Museum vessel, indicated by yellow stripe on the float.
- Vessels over 25' should tie up in front of fixed pier
- 10' of water at low tide
- 50-amp electrical service is available. Water is NOT available.
- \$2.50 per foot, per night (MMM members receive 10% discount)

### **Deering Pier—South End**

- Fixed 75' pier for vessels greater than 50'
- Three phase, 220v, 100-amp electrical current is available
- Potable water is available
- 14' of water at low tide
- \$2.50 per foot, per night (MMM Members receive 10% discount)

### **Moorings**

- Eight moorings are available. Dry weights range from 1800—5000 lbs
- See mooring map inside for weights and locations
- All moorings are granite with a scope 3:1
- Moorings have 20' of  $\frac{3}{4}$ " bottom chain and 45' of  $\frac{3}{4}$ " nylon rope.
- \$30.00 per night (MMM Members receive 10% discount).

## MMM General Information

- Moorings and dockage are available on a 24-hour basis. If arriving after 17:00, when the Museum is closed, Captain must check in at the Admission Desk at 09:30 the following morning. Check-out time is 12:00.
- Tenders are to be tied to the “Dinghy Dock” located on the south end of the fitting-out pier.
- The Visiting Yachtsman Building is open 24-7 and available to boaters. Amenities include restrooms with showers and washer/dryer.
- Only service animals are allowed on the Museum’s campus or in Museum buildings.
- One parking space is available per boat in the Museum’s south (overflow) parking lot. Vehicle access to the Museum campus is not permitted.
- The Museum is open from 9:30am-5pm daily. A paid mooring or docking fee includes two adult admission tickets.
- Only crew and passengers are permitted on the Museum grounds after dark.
- Access to Washington St is through the Museum building or through the gate to the south of Donnell House.
- Bath has bus service and trolley service from the Museum to downtown. Schedules are available at the Admission Desk. Local taxi service is Platinum Plus Taxi at 207.443.9166.
